- ♦ **The Alberta Child Health Benefit – 1-877-469-5437.** The Alberta Child Health Benefit is a health benefit plan for children in low-income families. The program offers coverage of dental, optical, emergency ambulance and prescription drug services. Please see the enclosed brochure for program details and eligibility.

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- ♦ **The Disability Tax Credit Information** – This is a non-refundable tax credit that you can use to reduce the amount of income tax you have to pay. - ♦ **Parking Placards for Persons with Disabilities.** A parking placard and/or disabled license plate enable those with the greatest needs to use specially designated parking facilities. The placards are issued for individuals who provide proof of eligibility under this program. Eligibility is defined as persons unable to walk more than 50 meters. Physicians, occupational therapists or physiotherapists can approve an application form. - ♦ **Special Education Funding - PUF Funding - 1-780-422-6326 or toll free by dialing 310-0000.** Preschool children that have special needs are eligible for PUF funded preschool programs. Please see the criteria in the information enclosed or call the above number for additional information.
- ♦ **Preschool Options List** – We have enclosed our preschools options list for your information. On this list, you will find preschools that specialize in programs for children with special needs and programs that integrate children with special needs. Many of the preschools listed on our list, also have support staff such as speech therapists, physical therapists and occupational therapists. They may also have a higher ratio of adults to children and the schools listed have had experience accessing PUF funding. Community preschools may also access PUF funding, but they must be an accredited ECS operator and an ECS teacher must oversee the program. Community preschools can contact Alberta Learning – Special Education Funding, at the above number for more information.
